ST. VINCENT de PAUL (SVdP) STORY

Over 350 years ago, St. Vincent de Paul, a priest in France heard the call of Jesus. Born in 1580 in Paris, he believed each encounter with the poor gave him a glimpse of the face of Jesus, galley slaves, abandoned babies, widows, and the sick.

Vincent de Paul ran his ministry until he died in 1660. He was canonized in 1737. Just over 170 years after St. Vincent's death, a twenty-year old university student named Frederic Ozanam, organized a group of young people to visit the poor in their homes. They called themselves the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. SVdP came to the US in 1845 and to Seattle in 1920.

Client stories are based on fact. That is what we want to report to our Parishioners and donors. We also want to create an emotional connection with the donor. Generally the client will give you all the information you need. In the home visit, just keep reasonably good notes.

WHO?

A young mom who has five kids. She is a victim of domestic violence.

THE PROBLEM

Her power is going to be shut off in several days. Her rent is overdue. She may not be able to feed the kids if the power is turned off. If the power is shut off on a Friday, she may not have heat or power till Monday. It is supposed to be cold and maybe snow over the weekend.

WHERE?

She lives in our neighborhood.

WHEN?

Her needs are now. There is not any time to waste.

THE FIX---WHAT DID WE DO?

She was crying and didn't want her kids to go hungry or be cold around Christmas time. She was pleading for our help.

SAMPLE FUND RAISING | CASE STATEMENT TEMPLATE

Summary

Thank you for this opportunity to inquire about a \$ investment in St. Vincent de Paul of Seattle King County (SVdP) to expand programs that are proving effective in assisting people with low incomes and multiple barriers to take steps toward self-sufficiency. With the help of the (GRANTOR), SVdP will assist low income individuals work to achieve self-sufficiency by providing home visits, eviction prevention assistance, energy assistance, food bank services, health assessments, and individualized case management services.	
Mission and Problem Being Addressed	
Inspired by Gospel values, SVdP, a Catholic volunteer organization, leads individuals to join together to offer person-to-person service to the poor and the suffering. In King County we operate with a staff of 117 and more than 1,100 volunteers, all committed to our work of social assistance and social justice.	
Many families in our area are struggling with poverty. Over 2.4 million people went to 52 food banks King County last year. An alarming 27% of African Americans and 20% of Hispanics in King Co. are living at the federal poverty level (defined as \$23,021 for a family of four), according to thereport. In addition, calls to our Helpline via the Crisis Clinic's 2-1-1 line have gone up to 49,000 annually, an increase of over 58 percent in the past two years.	
St. Vincent de Paul of Seattle King County provides critical services to the neediest in our community who are striving to meet immediate needs, stabilize housing, and build new livelihoods. SVdP is unique among social service agencies in that we meet the needs of people in part by training and deploying 1,300 volunteers to make home visits, thereby increasing volunteerism in our community while assisting thousands of need people where they live. As these families seek solutions, they often must overcome systemic and personal barriers to self-sufficiency. SVdP responded to this by launching the Case Management Program. The case management program assists clients to change self-defeating thinking patterns in order to build self-sufficient lives. SVdP not only directly provides for basic needs, but we link those in need to resources – public assistance and nearby nonprofit agencies – that they often do not know are available. We will provide you with a complete list of our community partners if we are awarded this grant.	
Anticipated Outcomes SVdP's overall goal is to assist individuals to leave high-risk, unstable living situations to start building healthy, contributing lives in ways that are respectful, humble, and compassionate. Expected outcomes:	
1. Provide direct assistance including food, utility assistance, housing and service referrals, and financial assistance when needed to 205,000 participants (some duplicates included);	
2. Increase case management services to serve 70 participants annually. Services will include weekly one-hour sessions, individualized Action Plans, CBT and support.	
3. Provide health assessment services, including flu shots, blood pressure checks and health recommendations to approximately 150 clients at our food bank; and	
With the assistance of the SVdP will strengthen its core programs and expand its case management services to assist more individuals with both temporary and long-term solutions so they can take meaningful steps toward self-reliance.
